That means that it is time once again to thank the landscaping crew led by Cal Uzelmeier, Bob Snyder and Chet Davis for their tireless work keeping the property beautiful. Their efforts have made the grounds of the Moland House an increasingly popular place to take wedding pictures. If you did not get a chance to stop by over the summer to appreciate the landscape, you have plenty of time to enjoy it before it gets too cold. Come and take a walk on the nature trail as the leaves change color. It's fantastic!

Once again we had a spectacular Reenactment. We almost ran out of places to park! The weather was perfect, and thanks to Chairperson Jo-Anne Mullen and her crew of sixty volunteers, the day was a well-organized success. Special thanks go to Bob Snyder who handles the logistics; Sybil Johnson who did a terrific job with internet advertising; our own Moland Woodworkers led by Cal Uzelmeier and Dave Healy; Laura May and Jackie Schneck who organized the food concession; and our parking chief, Chet Davis. We also had a great article in the Intelligencer and Courier Times written by staffer Gwen Schrift that appeared just before the weekend. Here is a suggestion. If you saw the article and enjoyed reading it, a quick phone call to the Intel with a positive comment would be appreciated. This is the second year in a row that we were able to get that kind of press coverage

and it helps to let the editors know that such community based articles are welcomed.

The biggest new improvement, and one that is truly exciting is our new parking lot lights. Thanks to Chet Davis for heading the project. This year when you leave the Farmhouse Christmas Craft Fair or the Christmas Dinner after dark, you will be greeted with a well-lit parking lot and carriage lights on the stone pillars. This was a long time coming and required a significant amount of planning.

That being said, I think that this is a good time to remind our members that all of the improvements and maintenance done to the house and most of what is done on the property is done by volunteers, (we have no employees) or is paid for by the Warwick Township Historical Society. Last year we had to rebuild the dangerously leaning old bank barn wall at a cost of over \$20,000. The parking lot lighting project, which was done for the safety of our members and visitors, came close to \$19,000. We are now facing a \$2,000 improvement to our fire alarm system requested by the Fire Marshall.

We will be forever grateful. But, times have changed, and with the above-mentioned exceptions, we are on our own. Therefore, the next time you encounter somebody, friends or neighbors, who don't get this, set the record straight.
